Helping At Home to Develop Reading Comprehension



There is a lot more to reading than just pronouncing words! As readers we need to decode the words and understand and interpret what we read. Here are some questions you can ask your child about his/her reading:

- *What problem did the main character face? How do you think he/she is going to solve it? How would you solve it yourself?*
- *What message or lesson do you think the author is trying to get across to you as the reader?*
- *Do any parts of the story remind you of anything in your own life?*
- *What characteristics does the main character have? How do you know?*

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
